

April 6, 2009

The Buchanan County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, April 6, 2009 with Michael Ferreter, Chairman in the Chair, Ellen Gaffney, and Ralph Kremer present. Absent, none.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Motion by Kremer and second by Gaffney to approve the minutes of the March 30th meeting. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion by Kremer and second by Gaffney to approve claims filed with the County Auditor for payment in the amount of \$417,925.28. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion by Gaffney and second by Kremer to approve the quarterly report of the County Auditor in the amount of \$53,724.37. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion by Gaffney and second by Kremer to accept the resignation of Karen Arp, Clerk in the Auditor's office, effective March 10, 2009. All in favor, motion carried.

Auditor Cindy Gosse reviewed the FY08 Audit report with the Board.

The Board reviewed the request from the Safety Committee regarding a safety concern on the public/employee parking on Sixth Avenue. The Committee recommended for safety purposes that Sixth Avenue be investigated as a one-way street with diagonal parking. After discussion, motion by Kremer and second by Gaffney to proceed in contacting the City of Independence regarding this request. All in favor, motion carried.

The Board met with County Engineer Brian Keierleber to discuss the repairs to the Rowley shop. Engineer Keierleber stated the secondary road department would complete the repairs and install insulation this summer.

Discussion was held with Engineer Keierleber on funding the purchase of rail cars. Auditor Gosse updated the Board on information obtained from Bonding Attorney Robert Josten on bonding for funding the purchase. Due to time restrictions discussion will continue later.

Discussion on compensation time usage was discussed with Engineer Keierleber and Auditor Gosse, also present Deputy Auditor Karen Stephenson. Auditor Gosse submitted an explanation of compensation time according to the union contract from Renee Von Bokern. Supervisor Gaffney stated a request was made to allow additional carryover of compensation time. Auditor Gosse explained that if employees were allowed to carryover additional compensation time the liability to the county would be at a greater rate. No action was taken until additional information can be obtained from Ms. Von Bokern.

Motion by Gaffney and second by Kremer to approve the following resolution. On roll call all voted aye thereon. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION 09-16

WHEREAS, Buchanan County holds title to certain real estate described as follows:
