WHEREAS, the same was first previously read and passed by a vote of a majority of the Board of Supervisors on January 21, 2008, which action is recorded in Book U Page 106 of the Minutes of the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, the requirement for a third reading was waived.

NOW THEREFORE the following was read and voted upon for the second time by the Board of Supervisors, and it passed by a vote of a majority of the Board of Supervisors;

AND IT IS NOW THEREFORE ENACTED AND ORDAINED:

### **ORDINANCE 08-01**

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE "BUCHANAN COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES 2008"

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF BUCHANAN COUNTY, IOWA:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to published notice and following public hearing on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of February 2008, as required by Iowa Code Sections 331.305 and 331.302, there is hereby adopted by Buchanan County, Iowa, the "BUCHANAN COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES 2008".

SECTION 2. All of the provisions of the "BUCHANAN COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES 2008" shall be in force and effect on and after the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts thereof in force on the effective date of this ordinance are hereby repealed from and after the effective date of this ordinance, except as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 4. The repeal provided for in the preceding section of this ordinance shall not affect any offense or act committed or done of any penalty or forfeiture incurred or any contract or right established or occurring before the effective date of this ordinance; nor shall such repeal affect any ordinance or resolution promising or guaranteeing the payment of money by the County or authorizing the issuance of any bonds of said County or any evidence or said County's indebtedness or any contract or obligation assumed by said County; nor shall said repeal affect the administrative ordinances or resolutions of the Board of Supervisors not in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of the "BUCHANAN COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES 2008"; nor shall it affect any other right or franchise conferred by an ordinance or resolution of Board of Supervisors or any other person or corporation; nor shall it affect any prosecution, suit, or other proceeding pending or any judgment rendered on or prior to the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 5. An official copy of the "BUCHANAN COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES 2008" adopted by this ordinance, including a certificate of the County Auditor as to its adoption and the effective date, is on file in the office of the County Auditor and shall be kept available for public inspection.

SECTION 6. The ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its publication, as required by law.

Adopted this 11<sup>th</sup> day of February 2008.

#### **RESOLUTION 08-16**

Authorizing a Loan Agreement and the issuance of \$4,550,000 General Obligation County Jail Bonds and providing for the levy of taxes to pay the same

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 331.402 of the Code of Iowa, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of Buchanan County (the "County"), State of Iowa, has heretofore proposed to contract indebtedness and enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") in the principal amount of \$4,550,000 to provide funds to pay the cost, to that extent, of constructing, furnishing and equipping a County jail and public safety center, which proposal was approved by the voters at a special election held on August 21, 2007; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary and advisable to provide for the levy and collection of taxes to pay the principal of and interest on \$4,550,000 General Obligation County Jail Bonds (the "Bonds"), to be issued pursuant to the Loan Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Buchanan County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The County hereby determines to enter into the Loan Agreement with a lender (the "Lender") to be hereafter determined, providing for a loan to the County in the principal amount of \$4,550,000 for the purpose or purposes set forth in the preamble hereof.

Section 2. The Bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the future, in the principal amount of \$4,550,000, and shall be dated as of the date of their delivery to the Lender.

Section 3. For the purpose of providing for the levy and collection of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same become due, there is hereby levied on all the taxable property in the County the following direct annual tax for collection in each of the following fiscal years:

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$348,005;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$349,143;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$348,833;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$348,190;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$347,205;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$350,868;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$349,000;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$346,755;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$349,123;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$345,910;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$347,285;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$348,045;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$348,170;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$347,770;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$346,700;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$349,940;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$347,255;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$348,988;

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$349,908.

provided, however, that at the time the Lender is selected, the actual tax levy amounts required to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds in each year shall be determined based upon the interest rate or rates at which the Bonds are issued, and this resolution shall be amended by resolution of the Board to provide for such actual and necessary tax levy amounts.

Section 4. A certified copy of this resolution shall be placed on file with the County Auditor of Buchanan County, and said Auditor is hereby instructed to enter for collection and assess the tax hereby authorized. When annually entering such taxes for collection, the County Auditor shall include the same as a part of the tax levy for Debt Service Fund purposes of the County and when collected, the proceeds of the taxes shall be converted into the Debt Service Fund of the County and set aside therein as a special account to be used solely and only for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds hereby authorized and for no other purpose whatsoever. Any amount received by the County as accrued interest on the Bonds shall be deposited into such special account and used to pay principal of and/or interest due on the Bonds on the first payment date.

Section 5. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Passed and approved February 25, 2008.

The Board proceeded as the Board of Canvassers to canvass the votes cast at the February 19, 2008 City of Hazleton Special Election. The results were as follows: Wayne V. Holliday 20; Joseph M. Kout 48; Danette Lujan 16 and scattering 1. The Board declaring Joseph M. Kout elected to fill the vacancy for two years. Motion by Ferreter and second by Kremer to place the canvass on file with the County Auditor, forward an Abstract of Election to the City of Hazleton and pay the claims for the election. All in favor, motion carried.

The Board met with Sheriff Bill Wolfgram and Emergency Management Director Rick Wulfekuhle to discuss the courthouse generator test report. The Board took no action until additional information can be obtained.

The Board met with Engineer Brian Keierleber, Fred Smock, Bill Versluis and Jon Holland representing RASH ride and Brew-B-Q bike ride committees. Committee members commended Buchanan County for the care of their roads and the cooperation of the Sheriff's department and the Engineer's department during the rides. Upcoming rides for the summer were discussed. The Board took no action.
